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1 2 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay, 3 everyone. Welcome to the Farmingdale 4 Village Board of Trustees Work Session for Monday, February 1st. 5 6 We'll start off with our regularly 7 scheduled business items; do we have any corrections? 8 9 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: The 10 pledge -- Mayor, pledge. 11 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No, we 12 don't --13 BARBARA KELLY: No, that's to the 14 regular. 15 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: Sorry, sorry, sorry, Mayor, jumping the 16 17 gun. 18 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Are you new 19 here? 20 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: Jumping the gun. 21 22 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: The 23 corrections of the minutes, or any 24 additional announcements. We'll do the corrections of the minutes first. 25

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1 2 - 1 - 212 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: I found 3 nothing. 4 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: I 5 didn't have any. 6 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: I did not 7 see any corrections. TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: All good. 8 9 BARBARA KELLY: Oh, thank you, 10 oh --11 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: If Cheryl 12 says it's good, it's good. 13 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay, the 14 announcements. 15 I want to add, I'm just going to add to the announcements that the St. 16 17 Patty's Day has been postponed. 18 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay, that was on my list. 19 20 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Hopefully, we can do it in September. I'd like to do 21 22 something when this whole mess is over, 23 and maybe it will be over, or over enough 24 for us to do something come September. 25 Nobody knows, nobody has a crystal ball

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1 2 - 1 - 212 that well. 3 Anything -- any other 4 announcements? 5 Did we announce that we won Best 6 Downtown Village for the seventh time. TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: I don't 7 think so. 8 9 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay, I'll 10 add that on. 11 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Do you 12 think we should announce something 13 regarding the Judge? 14 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah, I was going to give a moment of silence --15 16 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: At the 8:00 17 meeting? 18 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: (Continuing) 19 -- yeah, yeah. 20 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Okay. 21 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: But thank 22 you, Anthony. 23 CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Hello, 24 guys. 25 GROUP: Hey, Claudio.

1 2 - 1 - 212 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Oh, Johnny 3 come lately. 4 CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Hey, easy, 5 easy. We just got power back in the office building, and now I got my internet 6 back at home; everything is great. 7 8 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Good. 9 STEVE FELLMAN: How's your 10 snowblower? 11 CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: My 12 snowblower, you know, I chopped up that 13 poker thing. 14 You know, I took it off, and I put 15 it on top of the car, and then went back to look for it, and I'm like, oh, lost it, 16 17 and then I proceeded to snow blow, and it 18 got stuck in the --19 STEVE FELLMAN: Oh. 20 CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: (Continuing) -- yeah, thanks for asking, 21 22 Steve. 23 STEVE FELLMAN: Well, that's 24 because I had a problem, and Walt had a problem. That's why we --25

3	was three people, okay.
4	STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah.
5	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT:
6	Claudio, my snowblower was perfect.
7	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay.
8	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: I
9	have a thing on the Workforce Housing. I
10	just want to go over it with Claudio.
11	MAYOR EKSTAND: Okay.
12	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT:
13	Claudio, on page one, we say at or below
14	fifty percent (50%), and no greater than
15	sixty percent (60%). But then Type II
16	says at or greater than sixty percent
17	(60%), but no less than eighty percent
18	(80%).
19	So, if someone's more than 50 but
20	less than let's see, so sixty percent
21	(60%) is Type I. Yep, all right, sixty
22	percent (60%) is Type I; 60 to 80 is Type
23	II; and greater than 80 is Type III; but
24	less than 100.
25	Okay, I have a stupid question

1 2 - 1 - 212 then; I'm done. 3 CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: No stupid 4 questions here. 5 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: 6 Thank you. 7 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: You know, I looked at it a little differently. 8 Ι 9 looked at Type I as sixty percent (60%) 10 and below; Type II, eighty percent (80%) 11 and below; and then Type III, one hundred 12 percent (100%) and below. 13 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yeah, 14 that's what I did. 15 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Oh, okay. I thought maybe I was doing it wrong. 16 17 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: I don't 18 know if that's right or not; I don't know. 19 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No, I think 20 when we originally talked about it, we all agreed that was the way, so I did the same 21 22 thing guys. 23 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Okay. 24 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Claudio, 25 are we thinking it the right way?

2	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Yeah, I
3	don't think there's much difference
4	between what Bill is saying, and what you
5	guys are saying.
6	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay.
7	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: No, there's
8	not.
9	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: It comes
10	into play when you're in that Incentive
11	Provision, where you're going to have an
12	applicant, and you want to have some kind
13	of control over the development.
14	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay.
15	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay, any
16	other questions?
17	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT:
18	That's the only public hearing we're
19	having tonight; right? The other one
20	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: That's
21	correct, the other one is getting the
22	diagrams for us on the houses. Stevie
23	spoke to him.
24	Stevie, you want to explain what
25	Carlos said to you about the diagrams he

2	was going to make up for us?
3	STEVE FELLMAN: Oh, yeah, I said,
4	you know, I don't think anybody's
5	comfortable with just giving a blank check
6	to do whatever you want on these two lots.
7	You know, everything we've ever put
8	in the past, they knew what they were
9	approving, what was coming, and he said;
10	you know what, we kind of thought the same
11	thing.
12	They think that's a fair position,
13	and they're working on coming up with the
14	floor plans and elevations of what it is
15	they would actually want to do as part of
16	the proposal, because that's a fair
17	question.
18	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: For March.
19	STEVE FELLMAN: Well, for whenever,
20	but
21	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah they
22	the point that, yeah, got it, you know.
23	Thank you, Stevie.
24	Okay, moving right along. We just
25	have Fire Department.

2	I have nothing on the Fire
3	Department except for I saw they got
4	several calls during the snowstorm, and
5	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yeah.
6	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: (Continuing)
7	they were out they were out.
8	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Mm-hmm.
9	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: God bless
10	them.
11	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: There
12	were a couple of stuck cars around town.
13	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yeah,
14	besides stuck cars, they had some, you
15	know, ambulance calls.
16	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah.
17	Building Department. Anything any
18	questions for Stevie?
19	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT:
20	What's going on, Stevie, at Merritts;
21	anything different?
22	STEVE FELLMAN: No, still the same.
23	Crawling ever forward. Getting a little
24	bit done; a little bit done.
25	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Have we had

2	any response from Town of Oyster Bay about
3	the covenants and restrictions for the
4	wall?
5	STEVE FELLMAN: Not from them. I
6	sent an e-mail to the developer.
7	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay.
8	STEVE FELLMAN: And he has yet to
9	respond.
10	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay.
11	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Okay, so
12	what do you say guys and Claudio; how do
13	we shake them up a little bit?
14	We don't you know, I don't want
15	him to say at the end, you never told me.
16	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Send it to
17	his lawyer.
18	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Do we have
19	Steve, do you have his contact
20	information; but you don't have the
21	lawyer's contact info?
22	STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah, I'm not sure
23	who his lawyer is.
24	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Maybe it's
25	on one of the applications or permits?

2	STEVE FELLMAN: You know, I don't
3	even know if that would matter, because
4	the team he started with is not the team
5	that's there now.
6	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Uh-huh.
7	STEVE FELLMAN: So, I wouldn't be
8	sure of anything.
9	I'll give you his information, I
10	think if he hears from the Village
11	attorney, that might
12	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Okay.
13	STEVE FELLMAN: Apparently, he's
14	not impressed with me. Few people are,
15	though.
16	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Shoot me
17	an e-mail, and then a copy of what you
18	sent him.
19	STEVE FELLMAN: Okay.
20	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: I
21	was talking with Anthony. Anthony had, I
22	think a good point, you know, where we
23	were talking last week that the C/O would
24	require the homeowners to maintain the
25	wall.

2	But I think Anthony was saying
3	and I kind of agree with it is that the
4	Village should determine when the wall has
5	to be replaced or somebody should it
6	shouldn't be the individual homeowner
7	deciding, you know, when to fix the wall.
8	I think somebody should say, hey, the wall
9	has to be fixed.
10	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Wait a
11	second, hold on.
12	Claudio?
13	MR DEBELLIS: Yeah.
14	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Let's think
15	of our liability.
16	Let's say we don't do an
17	inspection, or we let it run, and all of a
18	sudden the wall crumbles, because it's in
19	writing or in the covenant that the
20	Village is supposed to say when it's to be
21	repaired or replaced
22	STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah.
23	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO:
24	(Continuing) couldn't that be a problem
25	to us?

2	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Yeah, I
3	think the fact that our Building
4	Department is going to be on it, and say
5	you got to
6	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No, no.
7	STEVE FELLMAN: Once somebody lives
8	there
9	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No.
10	STEVE FELLMAN: (Continuing) I'm
11	not going in somebody's backyard.
12	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Yeah, but
13	how are we going to find out if there's a
14	problem with the wall?
15	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: When he
16	calls.
17	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Alex will
18	tell us.
19	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: Oh,
20	no, not when it falls.
21	CLAUDIO DEBELLIS, ESQ.: Yeah, I
22	don't, I don't
23	STEVE FELLMAN: Again, these kind
24	of walls it's not a catastrophic
25	when they start to fail, you start to get

2	run-off, you start to get different things
3	going wrong. It's not, you know, the
4	Kansas City Bridge where it comes tumbling
5	down and 400 people get killed or
6	something.
7	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: What's the
8	expected life of a wall like this?
9	STEVE FELLMAN: Fifty years
10	minimum. These are the coolest blocks
11	I've ever seen in my life.
12	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay, 50
13	years minimum, okay.
14	STEVE FELLMAN: So
15	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Well
16	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: I don't
17	think we have to worry about it.
18	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah, I
19	don't think I'll be around.
20	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yeah, yeah.
21	STEVE FELLMAN: But in seriousness,
22	yeah, the homeowner has to be responsible.
23	Like any wall like any retaining wall,
24	they have to be responsible for it, and
25	they have to let us know. I mean, you

1 2 - 1 - 212 know, I don't think it's right to say, you 3 know --4 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: I mean, 5 because we --6 STEVE FELLMAN: -- yearly 7 inspectors or something on a retaining wall. Retaining walls happen all the 8 time. 9 10 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Right, we 11 don't go around inspecting wood retaining; 12 right? Railroad ties that are retaining 13 walls, we don't go around inspecting all 14 of them; right? 15 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: We don't inspect anybody's retaining wall. 16 17 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Okay so, 18 it's in the covenant and restrictions, and 19 it's --20 STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah, as long as 21 they're responsible for it, then guess 22 what, they're responsible for it. 23 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Right. 24 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Speaking of 25 Merritts Road. The County, as of when I

2	was going the second time I went around
3	town, was around between 4:00 and 4:30,
4	and as of that time the County did not
5	come back to do Merritts Road.
6	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: You're
7	kidding.
8	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No, and they
9	never did Main Street. We did Main
10	Street.
11	STEVE FELLMAN: As always.
12	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Well, no
13	well, you see that takes we have to use
14	our capital trucks with the bigger plows;
15	right? Because of the width of the plow
16	blade, and that takes them from time off
17	from them doing the hill, because they
18	have to do Main Street.
19	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Yup.
20	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Because the
21	County never did.
22	We'll look into that after the
23	fact, but you know, for now, just let it
24	be known that we had to do Main Street
25	and

1 2 - 1 - 212 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: We should 3 charge the County. 4 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Maybe we 5 should put that out, because on Facebook earlier today, there was some complaints 6 7 about the Village not getting to some 8 people's streets. 9 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: Yeah. 10 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: There's 11 always going to be complaints. 12 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: There's 13 always --14 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: 15 That's ridiculous, I mean, I think our guys did a great job again. 16 17 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Absolutely. 18 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Well again, 19 we had -- I don't know if you heard me. 20 According to the National Weather Service, 21 Farmingdale had 19 inches of snow. 22 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Wow. 23 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yeah, 24 unbelievable. 25 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Nineteen

2	inches of snow, and the problem is when it
3	comes down at two inches an hour, you
4	can't catch up. It's impossible to catch
5	up when you have 19 miles of road to plow.
6	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Well, I
7	think they did a great job over here
8	because they really stayed on top of it. I
9	don't know I know John Langan I
10	don't know who was in the other truck, but
11	they did a great job in our area.
12	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: Well,
13	sometimes people complain, but they don't
14	realize they're not Village roads. They
15	think Melville Road is a Village road,
16	they think, you know
17	STEVE FELLMAN: Right.
18	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY:
19	(Continuing) they think Main Street is
20	a Village Road and Merritts.
21	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Well, if
22	they were on Merritts, yeah, Merritts was
23	horrific, yeah.
24	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: And you
25	know, Melville is kind of tough going over

2	the railroad tracks, and then there's
3	always, you know, a few spots where people
4	leave their cars, that it's just hard to
5	get cleared up, and it's still, you know,
6	ongoing. It's a huge storm, and there's
7	still going to be work to be done.
8	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: And it's so
9	hard to do
10	STEVE FELLMAN: Its still snowing.
11	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: (Continuing)
12	the parking lots in between the cars,
13	you know. The last I saw was Russ was
14	doing Parking Lot 3, and there was about
15	15 cars in Parking Lot 3, and you know,
16	and of course, they're not all in one
17	spot.
18	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Right.
19	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: They're all
20	over the place, and it's the same with the
21	train station, and all the other lots, you
22	know.
23	It just happens.
24	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Yup.
25	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: And then

2	sometimes, you know, people are trying to
3	clear their own driveway they get their
4	cars all in their driveway, and it's time
5	to clean your driveway, so you put your
6	cars in the street, so you clean your
7	driveway.
8	What happened to me was, exactly
9	the same time we did that, the plow came
10	down. So we had to hustle up and get the
11	cars off the street again.
12	So, it is what it is. We're doing
13	the best we can do.
14	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Will they
15	be out at all tomorrow cleaning up the
16	streets; whatever is left over?
17	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah, I've
18	been speaking to Andy all day, and they're
19	going to go to bed early, let the rain
20	come, because we're supposed to get rain
21	tonight.
22	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Right.
23	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: And Carl,
24	I'm at a Village meeting, I'll call you
25	back. As long as you didn't cut off your

1 2 - 1 - 212 finger. 3 I always worry about when he calls me, he cuts off his finger, you know. 4 5 DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT: 6 Yeah, not good. MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: You know, 7 8 anyway, Andy said they're coming back at 5:00 -- 5:00 in the morning. 9 10 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Oh, okay. 11 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: And 12 that's --13 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Before too 14 many people get their cars out on the 15 road; right? 16 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: And The 17 Laurel Group was starting at 5:00. I did 18 not go back out and check The Laurel 19 Group. They were doing the Five Corners, 20 Park sidewalk, the Village walkways to the 21 parking lots, and cutting some --22 TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: Did they 23 do Main Street today; it looked pretty 24 good when I drove by around midday. 25 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No.

2	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: Someone
3	did Main Street; no?
4	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No.
5	TRUSTEE WALTER PRIESTLEY: I guess
6	it was the business owners.
7	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: If it was on
8	the on my side of the block, the
9	Farmingdale Meat Market does a path from
10	all the way up the block on my side. But
11	they don't go on the other side, and The
12	Laurel Group is also going to make sure
13	the crosswalks are clear, and that there's
14	some spaces every two stores they're
15	going to cut through the government strip
16	so people can get in and out of their cars
17	easier.
18	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: Good.
19	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: And as we
20	know they cross the street not in the
21	crosswalk, but you know.
22	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: What do you
23	think about
24	TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: So is the
25	plan to take the payloader into Main

1 2 - 1 - 212 Street early in the morning --3 TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: I was just 4 going to ask that question. 5 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: 6 (Continuing) -- and take that Main Street area and shut it down --7 8 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: No, they 9 can't do that because they still have to 10 finish the parking lots. 11 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Wow. 12 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: The parking 13 lots are, you know, it's -- when we have a 14 major snowfall there's just not enough 15 time for them to do everything, so the -we have to -- they're going to do a 16 17 touch-up, and focus on clearing the lots 18 when there's no cars in them. 19 TRUSTEE ANTHONY ADDEO: Absolutely. 20 So maybe Wednesday morning they could do 21 Main Street with the pay loader? 22 MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Well, we'll 23 talk on -- when we can -- they have to close Main Street, and -- Brian, do we 24 25 have the -- do you know if we have the

2	equipment now with the debris truck and
3	the capital truck, or do we have to borrow
4	a capital another debris truck from
5	Tobay.
6	BRIAN HARTY: No, we're good with
7	moving the snow out. We're fine with
8	that.
9	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: Yeah, that
10	was a godsend, fixing that debris truck,
11	it really was, that's
12	BRIAN HARTY: Yeah, the capacity on
13	that is a lot bigger than the
14	MAYOR RALPH EKSTRAND: That's huge
15	capacity.
16	So we'll team huddle on when they
17	can do it. That's a major that's an
18	all-night effort.
19	TRUSTEE CHERYL PARISI: There's
20	another the possibility of another
21	storm on Sunday night; I heard snow,
22	again. I don't know how many inches, but,
23	so
24	DEPUTY MAYOR WILLIAM BARRETT:
25	Cheryl, you got to find another channel.

2	STEVE FELLMAN: Stop listening to
