2 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Good evening,
3 ladies and gentlemen and welcome to the
4 Monday, March 22nd, 2021, Village of
5 Farmingdale, Board of Trustees work
6 session.

7 If everyone would kindly put their
8 hand over their heart and repeat the
9 Pledge of Allegiance with me.

10 (WHEREUPON, the Pledge of
11 Allegiance was recited by all those
12 present, after which the following
13 transpired:)

14 MAYOR EKSTRAND: And now a moment
15 of silence for our military personnel
16 defending freedom throughout the globe and
17 also for our first responders who are
18 always putting themselves in harm's way.

19 (WHEREUPON, a moment of silence was
20 observed by all those present, after which
21 the following transpired:)

22 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Thank you. Thank
23 you very much.

24 First on the agenda, we have a
25 resolution to adopt the Public Employer

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2 Health Emergency Plan.

3 Brian, could you give us just a
4 little scoop on this?

5 BRIAN HARTY: This was a
6 requirement by the State, State
7 Legislation, that we all do this and we
8 were fortunate to have someone share their
9 report with us. It was an attorney who
10 wrote this up, Ronnie Schatzenheimer
11 (phonetic) from another Village and we
12 tailored it to our Village, and that's
13 where it stands. Thanks to Barbara, she
14 was the contact with Ronnie.

15 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay, and this
16 also has to be adopted prior to April 1st;
17 correct?

18 BRIAN HARTY: That is correct.

19 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Yup. State
20 Government in work.

21 TRUSTEE PARISI: Well, we haven't
22 even discussed it. I mean...

23 MAYOR EKSTRAND: That's okay. I'm
24 listening. I'm open to comment.

25 TRUSTEE PARISI: It's not that I

2 have comments. I mean I read it quickly.

3 I -- I -- I think it's crazy that we got

4 it on Friday and we have to vote on it

5 today. That's my comments.

6 TRUSTEE ADDEO: It covered a lot of

7 bases.

8 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Well, that's --

9 TRUSTEE PARISI: Does it cover

10 everything? I mean, I don't know.

11 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Well, if it

12 doesn't, we can amend it, but we have to

13 have a plan in place by the 1st of the

14 month.

15 Brian, was this taken from NYCOM?

16 Out of curiosity.

17 BRIAN HARTY: That's correct.

18 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay. So what

19 we're doing is we're really plagiarizing

20 NYCOM's work.

21 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: So, in other

22 words, after we look at it and study it,

23 if we need to amend it, we can amend it at

24 a future meeting.

25 MAYOR EKSTRAND: There's no reason

2 why we can't.

3 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: If we need to.

4 MAYOR EKSTRAND: If we need to.

5 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: We can vote for
6 it now and then if we need to amend it, we
7 can always amend it later.

8 MAYOR EKSTRAND: That's correct.

9 TRUSTEE PARISI: Don't we want to
10 at least wait for Bill?

11 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Yeah, okay, I can
12 wait -- we can wait for Bill.

13 Okay, resolution to approve the
14 Commander Fleet Corp. -- to approve
15 Commander Fleet Corp. as lowest bidder to
16 outfit the new Fire Department's Chief's
17 vehicle in the amount of \$17,291.90. This
18 is what we had the missing page for and
19 everybody has found the missing page.

20 Welcome, Bill.

21 We will entertain, if you choose to
22 do so, a motion.

23 We'll wait for Bill to unmute.

24 Give him a couple of seconds.

25 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: Ready.

2 Ready, Captain.

3 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Right now there's
4 a resolution to approve the lowest bidder,
5 which was Commander Fleet Corp., for the
6 outfitting of the Chief's car. We have
7 all the documents now. It's up to
8 somebody if they want to make a motion --

9 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: I'll make a
10 motion to approve that.

11 TRUSTEE ADDEO: I'll second it.

12 MAYOR EKSTRAND: All in favor?

13 (WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous,
14 affirmative vote of the Board members
15 present. Motion 5-0)

16 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay, Bill, we
17 were talking, just before you came in,
18 about the Public Employer Health Emergency
19 Plan that was -- we were told on Friday --
20 has to be approved prior to April 1st. We
21 were -- it was brought up that the -- what
22 we are voting for we plagiarized from
23 NYCOM. It wasn't done in-house. We used
24 the sample from NYCOM. And we also felt
25 that if -- Cheryl brought up, well, if we

2 find something wrong with it down the
3 road, or, you know -- in everybody's
4 defense, this was told to us on Friday
5 that we have to approve prior to
6 April 1st, which is sometimes the way
7 State government works. So with the
8 ability to change it -- and I'm looking at
9 my favorite lawyer, Claudio -- we can
10 change this at a later date. Yes,
11 Claudio?

12 (WHEREUPON, no response was heard.)

13 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Unmute yourself.

14 CLAUDIO DE BELLIS, ESQ.: I haven't
15 seen -- is it a simple resolution?

16 MAYOR EKSTRAND: It's a plan. It's
17 a public employees health emergency plan.
18 We can amend any type of plan that we
19 make, as time goes by, as -- it's a plan.
20 So we can amend the plan because plans
21 change.

22 BRIAN HARTY: Correct.

23 CLAUDIO DE BELLIS, ESQ.: Well, if
24 we need this in place by the American
25 Rescue Plan?

2 BRIAN HARTY: We need this is place
3 for the State of New York.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: This is
5 State of New York; has nothing to do with
6 the American Rescue Plan?

7 BRIAN HARTY: No, it does not.

8 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: Okay.

9 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay, knowing that
10 we can change it if we so desire.

11 Do we have a resolution to -- a
12 motion to approve the plan?

13 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: I make a motion
14 to approve the plan.

15 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Second?

16 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: I'll second
17 it.

18 MAYOR EKSTRAND: All in favor?

19 (WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous,
20 affirmative vote of the Board members
21 present. Motion 5-0)

22 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay. Resolution
23 to hire John Langon as a part-time
24 Firehouse Maintainer at a salary of \$15
25 per hour.

2 It's nice to see that we're filling
3 up a little bit of the part-time
4 maintainers. It's -- we've been a little
5 scarce and thin lately.

6 Motion to approve.

7 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: I'll make the
8 motion to approve it.

9 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Second?

10 TRUSTEE ADDEO: I'll second it.

11 MAYOR EKSTRAND: All in favor?

12 (WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous,
13 affirmative vote of the Board members
14 present. Motion 5-0)

15 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Lorraine, you can
16 pick which one of the three that all said
17 they'll second it at the same time.

18 BRIAN HARTY: Which one did you
19 pick, Lorraine?

20 COURT REPORTER: I picked Anthony
21 Addeo, he had the loudest voice.

22 BRIAN HARTY: Okay, that sounds
23 good.

24 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Well, he is a
25 lawyer, so we'll just leave it at that.

2 Fire Department? Anything?

3 BRIAN HARTY: Well, the Fire
4 Department had a hack and I believe it was
5 on the secondary computer in the dispatch
6 office, and it's been somewhat encrypted.
7 They're working with their vendor and
8 they're working with the insurance company
9 to figure out how to overcome what's
10 happened a second time in the Fire
11 Department.

12 TRUSTEE PARISI: Why don't they
13 just switch to our people?

14 BRIAN HARTY: I don't know. I
15 don't know if that would have prevented
16 this. I just don't know.

17 TRUSTEE PARISI: Well, all right.
18 Well, we seem to be secure.

19 MAYOR EKSTRAND: We don't have
20 people --

21 BRIAN HARTY: I already talked to
22 Tony (phonetic) about it so -- and see
23 what their opinion is on that -- on that
24 very question. But I haven't had an
25 opportunity to do it because it happened

2 on Friday. I just got back to work today.
3 I was off Friday. So I'll check into it
4 tomorrow.

5 TRUSTEE PARISI: Are they demanding
6 money like they did the last time?

7 BRIAN HARTY: Well, no, not to my
8 knowledge.

9 TRUSTEE PARISI: Okay.

10 MAYOR EKSTRAND: What I understand,
11 Cheryl, is they found the encryption
12 there. It was not activated yet.

13 TRUSTEE PARISI: Okay.

14 MAYOR EKSTRAND: As you know, what
15 they usually do with these hackers is
16 they'll put an encryption in the host --
17 in our case the Fire Department -- and
18 then wait like six or eight weeks because
19 by that time you've already lost all your
20 backups before the encryptment. Do you
21 know what I mean?

22 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yes.

23 MAYOR EKSTRAND: You can't -- if
24 they put it in and they spring it, you can
25 go back two weeks to your two-week backup.

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2 But usually after two months, you don't
3 have -- you've used all your backups and
4 you can't go back when it's not there.

5 So --

6 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yes.

7 MAYOR EKSTRAND: (Continuing) -- we
8 believe it was in one of those situations
9 where it's waiting to be hatched, but
10 hasn't been hatched yet.

11 BRIAN HARTY: But they're working
12 with their vendor to solve the problem at
13 this point. That's the latest we have on
14 it as of today.

15 Building Department. Is Steve on
16 yet, or no?

17 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Yeah, Stevie,
18 unmute yourself. Thank you.

19 STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah I'm here.
20 Yup, coming in. I'm here.

21 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Can you give the
22 Board an update on your -- with you viewed
23 the wall with Stevie Hyman at 20 Merritts.

24 STEVE FELLMAN: Yes, I viewed the
25 wall with Steven Hyman and he's very, very

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2 comfortable with it. Thinks everything is
3 fine.

4 As a matter of fact, I was a little
5 late getting on because we sent him back
6 up because there were assertions that
7 somehow all this has undermined the
8 driveway to the adjacent neighbor. They
9 send a team up, took photographs and have
10 sent a letter that I just read before
11 getting on now that said there's
12 absolutely no evidence of any undermining
13 whatsoever. They've photographed it for
14 now and if anything happens in the future,
15 we will now have a baseline to judge
16 again.

17 There was accusations that all the
18 trees have been compromised. We sent an
19 arborist up there. He examined it;
20 indicated that none of the root systems
21 have been compromised; all the trees are
22 fine.

23 There are two walls that are
24 offset, kind of, in the middle there and
25 there is -- you know, wondering why they

2 didn't attach, you know, and there's like
3 a slope down on the one backyard up -- up
4 to the retained area and there was concern
5 that this was going to lead to erosion of
6 some kind and, you know, almost like a
7 slide, if you will, of water coming down.
8 And Steven Hyman recognized it immediately
9 and I (sic) said, "You know what that's
10 for; right?" I (sic) said, "No; what?"
11 He goes that's so they have access,
12 they'll be able maintain up there (sic).
13 That's how they get the mowers up and the
14 weed whackers and people up there to
15 maintain, otherwise you'd have to go up
16 with like ladders to grabble (sic) the
17 wall. He said think about a sump. Ever
18 seen a sump? There's always that gate and
19 the ramp down. Well, this is the
20 opposite. Just a ramp up, so they can
21 maintain vegetation and stuff up there.
22 He's been very insightful. We'll keep a
23 close watch on it. Of course, nobody
24 wants anything bad to happen, obviously.
25 And the last concern -- and,

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2 Anthony, you will continue to help on
3 this -- is that when we ever get around to
4 issuing the C/O's for those houses we
5 need them to acknowledge that they are in
6 charge of maintaining that retaining wall
7 so they get anything on adjoining
8 neighbors that somehow they're
9 deteriorating their wall or somehow
10 impacting their wall, which they don't.
11 But I think we need that in the closing
12 documents for the adjoining neighbors.

13 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Thank you, Stevie.

14 Any questions for Stevie?

15 TRUSTEE PARISI: Do we know what
16 happened to our friend over there at the
17 end of 109 and Fulton Street?

18 MAYOR EKSTRAND: The towing
19 company.

20 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yeah.

21 STEVE FELLMAN: I do not. Their
22 building permit has run out. We've sent
23 them a letter indicating they have to
24 renew the permit. I've texted them
25 several times. He doesn't return my

2 texts. I've tried calling and it just
3 goes to voicemail and he's just kind of
4 ignoring me at the moment.

5 TRUSTEE PARISI: Okay.

6 MAYOR EKSTRAND: We know the
7 lawyer, if I remember correctly. When I'm
8 in there on Wednesday, we'll rattle the
9 lawyer's cage.

10 TRUSTEE PARISI: Have we heard from
11 the 368 Melville Road, the subdivision?

12 STEVE FELLMAN: The subdivision, we
13 have -- I put them together with the
14 gentleman who has done some stuff in the
15 Village before, when Robbie (sic) get
16 involved and take that over -- he would
17 propose exactly the houses he would build
18 there. He felt that he shouldn't go over
19 2800 square feet so that way it would
20 blend in with the neighborhood. I think
21 he's got the right idea. I put him
22 together with the attorney and I don't
23 know what's come of that, but we made
24 crystal clear there will be no blank
25 check. There's no subdivision until

2 everybody knows exactly what is going to
3 get built there.

4 TRUSTEE PARISI: Okay.

5 MAYOR EKSTRAND: All right. We're
6 all good on Highway.

7 Brian, anything with Water, Code
8 and Highway?

9 BRIAN HARTY: Am I still on or am I
10 muted?

11 STEVE FELLMAN: You're on.

12 BRIAN HARTY: Highway Department:
13 Iaboni is going to get started on the
14 cleanups in the parks very shortly.
15 Sometime this week.

16 Andy's working on flowerpots. He's
17 got -- I think it's 85 flower pots --
18 they're working on redoing those and we're
19 finishing the (inaudible) on track for the
20 building. So the building should be ready
21 to go out to bid in early April. Okay.

22 Water Department: The contract
23 signing is due for Wednesday, pending a
24 couple of issues that they've got with
25 insurance. They're cleaning that up this

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2 week. Hopefully, we get that contract
3 signed and underway as of Wednesday of
4 this week.

5 Electrical work with Bancker will
6 start this week, sometime around Wednesday
7 or Thursday, onsite. So we will have some
8 activity onsite this week, Wednesday or
9 Thursday.

10 Code Department, which is the next
11 issue down, we have interviews coming up.
12 We've got one tomorrow, maybe two tomorrow
13 of potential candidates for Code
14 Enforcement.

15 And that's what I have to report.

16 You have a letter in there from the
17 union thanking Walter for his generosity
18 during the snow events.

19 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Also, under
20 correspondence, one of our residents got
21 in touch with me and says maybe it would
22 be a good idea if you could bring to the
23 Board some sort of recognition for the two
24 first responders/trainers which jumped in
25 and took care of Phil. I think that's a

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2 great idea. Maybe we could invite them to
3 Village Hall and give them a citation from
4 the Village Board thanking them for --

5 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: We can wait
6 until we have open meetings and that way
7 we can do it with some people there maybe.

8 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Right, but if
9 we're all in favor of doing something like
10 that --

11 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: Of course.
12 Absolutely. I mean, I am.

13 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay, good. Good.

14 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: He's one of our
15 own, our firefighters.

16 MAYOR EKSTRAND: And the funny
17 thing is, back in the mid-1980's he came
18 to our Rotary -- he was a certified
19 instructor for CPR back then and he taught
20 our Rotary how to give CPR with that --
21 what do you call it? Life-size doll. I
22 think its name was Anna.

23 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: Annie.
24 Resuscitation Annie.

25 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Yeah, that's it.

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2 All right, anything else before we
3 go into exec? We've got a couple of
4 things.

5 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: Ralph, there
6 was some discussion about having a St.
7 Patrick's Day Parade in September. One of
8 the Chamber of Commerce Board Members
9 suggested we have like a catch-up parade
10 with a couple of different themes. I
11 mean, I know that's going to be a lot of
12 work to do something like that before we,
13 you know -- anybody have any thoughts
14 about what sort of parade, if we open up
15 the -- if we have a parade in September?
16 Because we're going to -- before you know
17 it, we're going to be having a Columbus
18 Day Parade and Holiday Parade and a
19 Halloween Parade, so I'm not sure that we
20 want to have a catch-up parade. Sounds
21 like a lot of work. But is there a theme
22 that we want to have for the September
23 parade besides St. Patrick's Day?

24 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Well, I was going
25 to say, why don't we all think about it.

2 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: We've got time.

3 MAYOR EKSTRAND: We've certainly
4 got time to discuss it. I'll give
5 everybody two weeks. That's plenty of
6 time to think of what we want to do and
7 how we want to move forward. This is all
8 hoping that the Governor's Executive
9 Orders will be lifted on gatherings en
10 masse, in public.

11 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: Right, we don't
12 even know if we're going to be able to do
13 it at that point.

14 STEVE FELLMAN: Again, I would
15 exercise caution. We all got a newsletter
16 from the West Islip School District -- the
17 entire West Islip School Districts are
18 basically in a catastrophic free fall of
19 new cases. They were going to bring back
20 the Junior class after they brought back
21 the Senior class. They wiped out half the
22 Senior class. They shut down bringing the
23 Junior class back.

24 East Islip School District,
25 they're setting records every week of new

2 cases. Fifty, sixty. Our high school
3 here at 110 new cases in the last week.
4 So this thing isn't even close to being
5 done.

6 TRUSTEE PARISI: One positive thing
7 is that at least people, starting Tuesday,
8 50 and older can -- are eligible for
9 vaccines. So that's -- that's a good
10 thing.

11 STEVE FELLMAN: Yeah, we need to
12 get the kids vaccinated.

13 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: And I heard
14 that over 30 percent of the population in
15 Nassau County has been vaccinated and
16 primarily the most vulnerable population,
17 the older and the immunocompromised. So
18 that's a good start.

19 TRUSTEE PARISI: Absolutely.

20 I just would like to say that last
21 Monday I asked if we could go look at
22 Bethpage Road and clean it up. And we
23 did. We cleaned it up on Wednesday. They
24 did a great, great job. And they're going
25 to go back this Friday, as long as it's

2 not raining, and work on it again because
3 National Grid and -- they're up there just
4 continuously ripping up the road. So we
5 did a great job cleaning it up. Yes. It
6 was one mess.

7 STEVE FELLMAN: It was, yeah.

8 TRUSTEE PRIESTLEY: Do we know when
9 the County is going to come in and do that
10 road over?

11 TRUSTEE PARISI: Well, they're
12 still working on it, so... I don't know.
13 They were on Anita Place today. What were
14 they doing on Anita Place; more gas
15 changing, more gas lines, I guess?

16 MAYOR EKSTRAND: That, I don't
17 know.

18 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yup, so...

19 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: Well, has
20 the Fire Department officially cancelled
21 Memorial Day?

22 MAYOR EKSTRAND: They're going to
23 do Memorial Day at a private service like
24 they did last year. They officially
25 cancelled the Memorial Day Parade, and

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2 they're just going to have a service. As
3 we know, our Veterans are our most
4 vulnerable.

5 DEPUTY MAYOR BARRETT: Yup.

6 TRUSTEE PARISI: When did they
7 cancel it? I didn't see anything.

8 MAYOR EKSTRAND: That's a good
9 question. I got a call from the Chief
10 saying it was cancelled. They're just
11 going to do the same thing, but I didn't
12 see it publicized anywhere.

13 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yeah, they usually
14 put -- yeah, 'cause -- exactly, you
15 usually see it on Facebook. They usually
16 put it with their -- you know, post it,
17 but I didn't see anything.

18 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Yeah, that's okay.
19 Brian will call the Chief tomorrow and get
20 a -- will do a Constant Contact with an
21 official statement from the Chief.

22 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yup.

23 BRIAN HARTY: Sure, no problem.

24 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Anything else?

25 TRUSTEE PARISI: Just so that you

2 know, the -- we're doing all of the
3 planting up at Ridge Road this year and
4 Ketchum Lane, and then Andy is going to
5 put all the pots out on Main Street and
6 the Green when it's done. We figured it's
7 a lot easier. The pots -- he took the
8 pots from Eastern Parkway, he moved them
9 up to Ketchum Road and he's changing them
10 over. And then in May we'll go up -- how
11 many volunteers we have, we'll go up to
12 Ridge Road and we will plant at Ridge Road
13 and then he will put them out on Main
14 Street. We won't have to lug them down
15 Main Street or anything else. The only
16 thing we're going to need again is for DPW
17 to hang the hanging baskets like they did
18 last year. We'll have them delivered up
19 to the yard again, and they're going to
20 have to hang them in all the lots and
21 stuff. We don't have the juniors
22 available to do it, so... And now
23 especially since Phil is --

24 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Do you have a time
25 frame for that, Cheryl?

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2 TRUSTEE PARISI: It'll be in May,
3 but I'll get all the information to Andy
4 and Ken.

5 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Thank you.

6 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yup.

7 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Thank you very
8 much. We greatly appreciate the
9 beautification of the Village.

10 TRUSTEE PARISI: Yeah, me, too. It
11 looks good. The people do a great job.

12 MAYOR EKSTRAND: Okay, are we good
13 for a motion to go into exec?

14 TRUSTEE ADDEO: Yes, I'll make that
