Mayor Ekstrand opened the meeting at 7:05 PM with the pledge of allegiance and a moment of silence.

**VETERAN'S EXEMPTION** – Upon a motion made by Trustee Priestley and seconded by Trustee Parisi, it was unanimously,

**RESOLVED** (#2022-03-16), to remove a Veteran's Exemption on 2 Arthur Street (49-224-3) because the property was sold.

**USE OF FACILITIES – BASEBALL LEAGUE –** Upon a motion made by Trustee Priestley and seconded by Deputy Mayor Barrett, it was unanimously,

**RESOLVED** (#2022-03-17), to approve a request from the Farmingdale Baseball League to hold their Annual Opening Day Parade on Sunday, April 24, 2022. The parade will assemble at the Howitt Baseball fields at 1:30 p.m. and kick off at 2:00 p.m. The parade will make a left from Howitt to Conklin Street and make a left on Main Street and proceed south to a right on Motor Avenue to Allen Park.

**USE OF FACILITIES – GOOD FRIDAY –** Upon a motion made by Trustee Parisi and seconded by Trustee Priestley, it was unanimously,

**RESOLVED** (#2022-03-18), to approve a request from the Spanish Charismatic Renewal Group from St. Kilian's to have a walk commemorating the Stations of the Cross on Friday, April 15, 2022 (Good Friday) from 12:00 Noon until approximately 3:00 p.m. The walk will begin at the cafeteria of St. Kilian School and proceed south onto Rose Street, then left on Richard Street, then left on Cherry Street, and left on Wesche Drive, ending at the school cafeteria.

  - O Dark Horse (277 Main Street) expanding to second floor and will have games (arcade-like) and will need 3 parking spaces at \$5,000 each.
  - 313 Main Street 44 seat restaurant will require 2 parking spaces at \$5,000 each.

- The Carlyle (formerly Robbie Lee) will restart construction in the near term, ordered steel for superstructure. The owner reported that he is waiting for financing.
- 7-11 and Sunoco are waiting for Southland, approval filed and denial letter issued.
- O Peter Florey/D&F Development (Sterling Green) have received approval from New York State and have submitted plans and an application for a building permit. The first stage of review has been completed by H2M, building permit to be issued by approximately May 1, 2022.
- o 505 Conklin St. (formerly taco store) will be coming in for a Special Use Permit as they have a permit for more than 12 seats.
- o Ladies boutique possible for 223 Main Street.
- 52 Maple Street has heating and occupancy issues. Summons was issued, no response from the property owner.
- Rodent and property maintenance issues are being addressed on Cobb Place, summons has been issued.

- o Grocer on Rte. 109 has been repeatedly advised that window lighting surrounds are not allowed, summons has been issued.
- 94 Grant Street has been cited as an illegal 2 family residence, summons has been issued. Court date has been delayed until April.
- O Discuss fines daily vs. weekly, needs follow up.
- Realtor advertising fines for illegal apartments, fines for unauthorized signage affixed to poles or lawn signs.
- Need a general poster to be placed on properties for public notification.
  Layout taken to Island Digital, the size will be 3 x 5.
- Racanelli DPW Garage pricing has been received, other proposal is being sought. Foundation soil test is underway to determine if a different foundation can be used at a lower cost.
- o Working with 317 & The Nutty Irishman to handle waste stream/dumpsters.
- o Former auto body at Rte. 109 and Conklin St. has had no activity. Need to contact the lawyer for the property.
- o Lily Flanagan's is taking over Farmingdale Brew Co.
- o A recap of Burgerology playing loud music was reported.
- Zoom meeting with LGBT Network (7:30): A number of issues were discussed,
  Village Attorney DeBellis will discuss contract terms with LGBT Network
  Attorney Agosti. An in-person meeting will take place on Monday, April 18 at 7:00 p.m.
- Highway Department:
  - o Lot maintenance and routine maintenance of Main St.
  - o Routine garbage pickup in parks and dog stations
  - Ongoing storm prep/planning and debris removal
  - Savik & Murray working on 5 Corners Park:
    - The balance of the project is nearing completion.
  - Received \$230,000 from National Grid for street repaving where National Grid installed new gas mains.
  - Final estimate for DPW Garage was received from Racanelli. Investigating soil condition to see if different foundation can be used as foundation costs

are high. Another quote is being requested as an option for the building, based on Carlos Calla plans.

- Parking Lot 3 damaged tree and stump were removed, will be replaced in the spring. An orange barrel has been placed there for safety.
- o DPW Garage renovations underway, completion is expected in 5 weeks.
- Light & pole on Lenox Rd. (between Bethpage Rd. and Hillside Rd.)
  ordered from Magniflood, replaced by the Town of Oyster Bay.
- o Boarded up 285 Secatogue Ave. and painted the boards white squatters had been in the abandoned home.
- o Plaques installed at Sven Brost sculptures.
- o Flower pots prepped for Main Street.
- Stapleton took dead branches from tree at 54 William St.
- o Courtroom was prepped for voting and chairs were reset.
