2	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good evening,
3	ladies and gentlemen.
4	If you could all just please stand
5	and join us in the Pledge of Allegiance.
6	(WHEREUPON, the assemblage recited
7	the Pledge of Allegiance, after which the
8	<pre>following transpired:)</pre>
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And if you don't
10	mind, just remain standing for one moment
11	as we honor both our military and our
12	first responders, policemen, and firemen
13	for the jobs that they do every day in
14	protecting our security.
15	(WHEREUPON, a moment of silence was
16	observed by the assemblage, after which
17	the following transpired:)
18	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Thank you.
19	Please be seated.
20	Today is October 25, 2022. We are
21	the Farmingdale Village Planning Board.
22	There are three items on the itinerary for
23	this evening.
24	When we call out your application,
25	if you'd be kind enough, please, just come

2	to the front, state your name and address
3	for the record, so she can record it
4	(indicating), and then you can make your
5	presentation in regards to the
6	application.
7	The first one on the Calendar this
8	evening is 196 Melville Road.
9	MR. MIGNONE: How are you?
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good.
11	MR. MIGNONE: What do you want to
12	know?
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Name and address
14	for the record.
15	Welcome, Mr. Mignone.
16	MR. MIGNONE: Hey, how are you.
17	196 Melville Road, Farmingdale, New York.
18	It's an application for a circular
19	driveway of permeable pavers and, I think,
20	a fence. It looks like it's on here on
21	the adjoining lot.
22	MR. FELLMAN: Let me just double
23	check where the fence is because you can't
24	have a fence on the front yard.
25	MR. MIGNONE: It's marked in

2	yellow, but I don't know if he just wants
3	it to come across here (indicating). I
4	have no idea.
5	MR. FELLMAN: Yeah, we don't permit
6	fences in the front yard.
7	MR. MIGNONE: You can't put it
8	there, okay.
9	MR. FELLMAN: It's got to be back
10	at the face of the house.
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Is the fence on
12	the application?
13	I didn't see the fence on the
14	application.
15	MR. MIGNONE: It's written in on
16	this survey that I have, but I don't know.
17	It says fence fee, driveway two
18	fees for the driveway, and a fee for the
19	fence, and a building permit fee. So I
20	guess there's some type of fence permit,
21	but I don't know exactly where he wants to
22	put a fence.
23	MR. STAUDT: A fence is a separate
24	permit process isn't it?
25	MR. FELLMAN: Yeah.

2	MR. STAUDT: That goes through your
3	department?
4	MR. FELLMAN: Yeah. And like I
5	said, we don't permit fences in the front
6	yards.
7	MS. PEARSON: But there's an
8	existing fence right now?
9	MR. MIGNONE: There is an existing
10	fence there, yes.
11	MS. PEARSON: Okay.
12	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That's along
13	that
14	MR. MIGNONE: I think it comes
15	straight off the corner of the house
16	perpendicular to Melville Road.
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right, I saw.
18	Yeah, it says wood fence. It, actually,
19	is on the survey, so there is a fence
20	coming across there.
21	Okay, so measurement-wise, the I
22	guess that's got to be the western
23	starting point of the circular driveway.
24	That's got to be three feet off that
25	property line. I can't tell how much room

2	you have there.
3	MR. MIGNONE: Well, that's his
4	property. That adjoining lot is his lot.
5	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That's his lot.
6	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah.
7	MS. PEARSON: The one that's
8	adjacent to Taylor on the corner of
9	Taylor and Melville?
10	MR. MIGNONE: Yes. Parcel #3.
11	That's his lot.
12	MR. STAUDT: That's his property.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right. Right.
14	MR. MIGNONE: And it's a
15	non-buildable lot, so it's just part of
16	the piece of property.
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: All right. So
18	what is the typical turning radius on
19	something like this that's typically done,
20	and what's the width of a driveway?
21	MR. MIGNONE: I think we made it
22	nine feet. We, actually, started this job
23	and then, I guess, the Building Department
24	came and stopped us from working.
25	So, I think, the width of the

2	driveway is nine feet wide, and whatever
3	the radius is, it's enough to get a car in
4	there three cars. I don't know what
5	the actual radius is.
6	MR. STAUDT: So you're saying
7	Parcel #3 cannot be developed?
8	MR. MIGNONE: Well, it's only
9	25-feet wide. It's 25 x 33.
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: So I don't
11	portray to be an expert on circular
12	driveways, but the research I've done
13	seems to be talking about a minimum of
14	15-feet on the width of a circular
15	driveway, and we're at nine.
16	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah. I don't know
17	what the minimum width is, but we drove a
18	car
19	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I just picture
20	wheels going off the
21	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah, yeah, we
22	listen, a pickup truck is not going to fit
23	in there, but a regular car will.
24	MR. FELLMAN: It should be a
25	minimum of 12.

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2	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I probably feel
3	comfortable going slightly bigger than
4	nine feet.
5	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah, that's fine.
6	And it's not the total width. There's a
7	grass strip in the center. It's just
8	going to be the permeable pavers under
9	where the tires go.
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Oh.
11	MR. MIGNONE: So it's not the
12	complete driveway.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Oh, so they're
14	really looking to make a mess of this
15	property. Unless, they've got good
16	drivers.
17	MR. MIGNONE: I don't know.
18	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I gotcha. So
19	the permeable if they're just going to
20	do two strips
21	MR. MIGNONE: Three-foot wide
22	strips.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Three-foot wide
24	strips.
25	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah.

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2	MR. HOTHERSALL: On a curve.
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I'm not a fan of
4	the design, but I'm not the homeowner
5	there.
6	Steve, on a permeable paver strip
7	like that, is there a water mitigation
8	issue?
9	Because you can't put drains on the
10	side of paver strips.
11	MR. MIGNONE: No, no, no. They're
12	permeable. The water drains through it.
13	They're made that way.
14	MR. FELLMAN: The water drains
15	through them.
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right. I'm just
17	making sure we don't have any issue on
18	drainage, right, with permeable.
19	MR. FELLMAN: No.
20	MR. MIGNONE: That's why
21	MR. FELLMAN: They're, actually,
22	very effective.
23	MR. MIGNONE: (Continuing) we
24	called the Village prior to doing this.
25	They said do it permeable, you don't need

2	a dry well.
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: All right. I
4	mean, short of me not being a fan of the
5	design, I don't see that there's anything
6	outside of the Code here.
7	MR. MIGNONE: Well, you're not even
8	going to see it because once the grass
9	grows through it, you don't see the
10	permeable pavers anymore anyway, so,
11	basically, they're driving on grass no
12	matter what.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right. Right.
14	I got you.
15	I certainly think a 12-foot outside
16	border and
17	MR. MIGNONE: You want to make it
18	12-feet wide?
19	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Yeah, on the
20	outside borders.
21	MR. MIGNONE: Okay.
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And what do you,
23	typically, do for a strip?
24	Three or four feet?
25	MR. MIGNONE: Well, a strip on a

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2	straight-in driveway can be as small as
3	two feet, but, I mean, this isn't really
4	that common to do this.
5	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right.
6	MR. MIGNONE: And, normally, it
7	would be the whole thing, but he just
8	wanted to do two strips.
9	I mean, he does have two small cars
10	so, you know, one's a little BMW, and he
11	has a small SUV.
12	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. So,
13	maybe, if we do it 12-foot wide, we could
14	do four, four, four. Four in the center
15	and then four on each of the strips.
16	MR. MIGNONE: Two four-foot strips.
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Yeah. What do
18	you think about that?
19	MR. MIGNONE: I think whatever you
20	say is good with me.
21	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That will keep
22	them at least on their pavers for a higher
23	probability.
24	The turning radius is probably a
25	little bit shallow, but they're in a bad

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2	spot over there, so I get what they're
3	trying to do.
4	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah, they want to
5	get the cars there was just an accident
6	two weeks ago. They had a car parked
7	there that got totalled, that's why they
8	want to get the cars off the street.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: So the only
10	other concern I would have is if he ever
11	does it's separate properties, right,
12	if he ever goes to separate those
13	properties
14	MR. MIGNONE: Well, they can't be
15	separated because this one is only 25-feet
16	wide and 33-feet deep, so you could never
17	build anything on it. They're not getting
18	a variance to put up an 800-square-foot
19	house.
20	MR. STAUDT: Can we make it
21	conditional?
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: We can make it
23	provisional.
24	Do you know the measurements? Is
25	it the way it's drawn up, it looks like

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2	there's a couple feet between the edge of
3	the driveway.
4	MR. MIGNONE: Oh, there, actually,
5	is, but I don't know exactly what that
6	dimension is.
7	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: So cheat to
8	the
9	MR. MIGNONE: We cheated.
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: (Continuing)
11	cheat to the I guess that's the north
12	side. Cheat to that side so you get three
13	feet off that property line.
14	MR. MIGNONE: It reduces the
15	radius.
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right.
17	MR. MIGNONE: He wanted to make it
18	as wide as there's also bushes there,
19	so he didn't want to get too close to the
20	bushes, and then there's a tree in the
21	middle that he does not want to remove, so
22	we, kind of, had to fit it in between the
23	house, the bushes, and the tree.
24	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right.
25	MR. MIGNONE: I don't think there's

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2	any room to cheat left.
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: It's tight.
4	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah. And right
5	along the fence line, there's a tree
6	there. So he didn't want to get it too
7	close to the tree and then have a root
8	problem.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I gotcha.
10	Anybody else have any additional
11	questions?
12	(WHEREUPON, no response was heard.)
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: So why don't I
14	start this off.
15	We'll make a motion to approve the
16	application for 196 Melville Road as
17	submitted.
18	The actual permeable pavers that
19	are to be used in four-foot strips with a
20	four-foot center median and then four feet
21	on the other side. If possible, they are
22	to push that right edge as far away from
23	that property line as possible.
24	There is a three-foot Code, but I
25	understand for safety purposes we're going

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2	to extend the benefit and modify the law
3	but keeping in mind to keep it to the left
4	as much as possible without compromising
5	your circular radius either.
6	MR. MIGNONE: That lot might be
7	deeded into his property anyway.
8	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I don't have
9	that information.
10	MR. MIGNONE: Yeah, you don't know.
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. And other
12	than that, I think because they're
13	permeable, there's no drainage issues, and
14	I would ask for someone to second that
15	motion if it's acceptable.
16	MR. STAUDT: I'll second it.
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: All those in
18	favor?
19	(WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous,
20	affirmative vote of the Board members
21	present. Motion passed 5-0.)
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good luck, Mr.
23	Mignone.
24	MR. MIGNONE: Have a good night.
25	* * * *

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2	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Second
3	application is Wine Me Up.
4	Come on down, state your name and
5	address for the record.
6	MR. HUANG: My name is Tommy Huang,
7	H-U-A-N-G is my last name. I'm filing the
8	application for 309 Main Street, front and
9	rear sign.
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. Let's
11	take a look.
12	Did you recently purchase this
13	business?
14	MR. HUANG: Yes.
15	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: You changed the
16	name, so you bought the business?
17	MR. HUANG: Yes.
18	MR. STAUDT: Congratulations.
19	MR. HUANG: Thank you.
20	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Welcome to
21	Farmingdale Village.
22	MR. HUANG: Thank you.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: So you're
24	looking to do a sign here on the front and
25	the back?

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2	MR. HUANG: Yes.
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: There's
4	currently an awning there; is that
5	correct?
6	MR. HUANG: Yes.
7	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Are you planning
8	on keeping the awning?
9	MR. HUANG: Yeah, the awning stays.
10	The sign is above the awning.
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That fine. So
12	we do have some anybody have some
13	concerns?
14	MR. STAUDT: Sure.
15	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I don't want to
16	take control on this one.
17	MR. STAUDT: When I look at the
18	rendering that you provided, it's
19	difficult to first of all, the layout
20	of the sign appears, visually, a little
21	messy.
22	When you look at the main logo
23	being off to the side off to the left
24	side and then wine and liquor is, kind
25	of, elevated above that in a separate size

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2	and separate color, and then the phone
3	number is smaller and lower to that.
4	So I have concern that there's a
5	lot going on, and, visually, it's a bit
6	messy compared to I think we were
7	saying in the back, the sign you're
8	planning to put in the back is a little
9	more straightforward and less visually
10	there's less going on visually.
11	It almost looks like you're trying
12	to insert the phone number, so things just
13	moved out of the way to get the phone
14	number in there. It just appears messy.
15	MR. HUANG: These designs I
16	discussed with the landlord, like, she's
17	giving me a lot of advice because you want
18	to put my d/b/a name, doing business as
19	Wine Me Up, like, getting people's
20	attention, you know, that's why the size
21	of the Wine Me Up is bigger than on the
22	right.
23	MS. PEARSON: Mr. Huang, what was
24	the decision about putting the phone
25	number on the sign?

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2	MR. HUANG: Oh, just, like, you
3	know, getting people can reach out to my
4	store and that's it.
5	MS. PEARSON: Because we noticed on
6	the existing awning there's a phone
7	number.
8	MR. HUANG: Yes.
9	MS. PEARSON: That was the previous
10	business?
11	MR. HUANG: Yes.
12	MS. PEARSON: Okay. Is there any
13	chance of putting the phone number on the
14	awning instead of on the sign?
15	MR. HUANG: What I'm going to do is
16	it's a small fabric you can see the
17	awning, it a red, I'm probably going to
18	remove that because it's small. It's,
19	like, about five inch width, so I'm
20	probably going to remove the previous
21	owner's phone number.
22	MS. PEARSON: Sure. You don't want
23	confusion.
24	MR. HUANG: Yeah. So is the
25	question is there a problem putting my

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2	store number the phone number, like, on
3	the right corner?
4	MS. PEARSON: Of the sign or of the
5	awning?
6	MR. HUANG: The sign.
7	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: We, typically,
8	don't do phone numbers on the sign if you
9	look at the Village. That's why.
10	MR. HUANG: Oh, okay.
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: It's not in the
12	Code, but being consistent with all the
13	prior we don't do it. That's why we,
14	typically, do it on the awning.
15	MR. HUANG: Oh, okay.
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That's why if
17	you wanted to redo the awning, we could
18	approve that tonight, provisionally, and
19	you can put your phone number back on
20	that.
21	MR. HUANG: Okay.
22	MS. PEARSON: You said you and the
23	landlord have designed this sign together?
24	MR. HUANG: She, kind of, give me,
25	like

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2	MS. PEARSON: Advice.
3	MR. HUANG: Advice. A lot of
4	advice. If you know him. He's the owner
5	of the Vico Pizzeria and the bar next to
6	the Vico.
7	MS. PEARSON: Yes. Another option
8	that we discussed is possibly switching
9	the wine and liquor with the phone number.
10	So where wine and liquor is, is the
11	phone number, smaller; and wine and liquor
12	where the phone number is; keeping the
13	Wine Me Up, but then switching where it
14	says wine and liquor and the phone number.
15	So the phone number on top, and the
16	wine and liquor on the bottom.
17	MR. HUANG: On the bottom?
18	MS. PEARSON: Yes, but preferably,
19	as Mr. Rosasco has said, generally, the
20	phone number is not found on the
21	businesses on Main Street.
22	MR. HUANG: Oh, we could if it's
23	against the Village, nobody put it on the
24	phone number, I can remove the phone
25	number and make it easier.

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2	MR. STAUDT: If you remove the
3	phone number, you can relocate wine and
4	liquor centered at the top, and it looks
5	more continuous.
6	MR. HUANG: In the middle. Okay.
7	Yeah.
8	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Let me ask you
9	this, Mr. Huang, do you like your back
10	sign?
11	MR. HUANG: Huh?
12	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Do you like the
13	back sign?
14	MR. HUANG: Yeah.
15	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Would you be
16	willing to do that in the front?
17	That same exact sign?
18	MR. HUANG: But the size of that
19	sign
20	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Of course it's
21	going to be bigger.
22	MR. STAUDT: It's going to be
23	longer.
24	MR. HUANG: Yeah, it's longer.
25	MR. STAUDT: But the layout.

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2	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I like the
3	layout of that.
4	MR. HUANG: Okay.
5	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: It's centered.
6	That way Wine Me Up is centered, okay?
7	It's got your wine and liquor in
8	there.
9	MR. HUANG: Okay.
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I mean, if
11	you're okay with that.
12	MR. HUANG: I can take the two
13	the both options, like, you know, remove
14	the phone number, putting the wine and
15	liquor in the center, or I take that same
16	one in the rear, but I have to see the
17	actual artwork of the signage construction
18	because I want to see how it looks.
19	MS. PEARSON: Right. You want to
20	see the mockup. We like the one in the
21	back.
22	MR. HUANG: Okay.
23	MS. PEARSON: This is much nicer
24	(indicating).
25	MR. HUANG: So I can go either one?

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2	MR. STAUDT: If you remove the
3	number.
4	MR. HUANG: Yeah.
5	MR. STAUDT: I mean, right, it
6	would be either one.
7	If you prefer to remove the phone
8	number and then center wine and liquor,
9	like, because the sign is long, if that,
10	visually, looks better, then we're
11	probably okay with that. But the back
12	sign does look nice.
13	MR. HUANG: Okay.
14	MR. STAUDT: Like the way it's
15	structured.
16	MR. HUANG: Okay.
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And then the
18	only other thing is that we do have a
19	requirement that you have some type of
20	metallic in your signs. Typically, the
21	way that we meet that requirement is tying
22	it into the border.
23	You've got a black border on it.
24	If you wanted to do a strip inside the
25	black of silver metallic, that would meet

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2	the requirements within the Village of
3	some type of metallic within your sign.
4	Is that a problem?
5	MS. PEARSON: Do you know what we
6	mean by metallic?
7	MR. HUANG: (No verbal response).
8	MS. PEARSON: Like shiny paint.
9	MR. HUANG: Mm-hmm.
10	MS. PEARSON: You know what I mean?
11	MR. HUANG: I don't think it's
12	shiny paint.
13	MS. PEARSON: No, no. It's not.
14	But the Village Code says all the signs
15	have to have a metallic paint component,
16	so it has to have a little bit, like,
17	usually, it's around the edge.
18	MR. HUANG: Yeah, yeah.
19	MS. PEARSON: Okay.
20	MR. HUANG: I think my edge is
21	black.
22	MS. PEARSON: Right.
23	MR. STAUDT: We need a metallic
24	component to that black, that's what we're
25	saying.

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2	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: We're saying
3	inside of the black, one-inch ring of,
4	maybe, silver leaf metallic or gold,
5	whichever you prefer, but the requirement
6	is some metallic.
7	MR. HUANG: It's going to be
8	aluminum. I think it's a metallic.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: No. The sign
10	itself is carved Kömacel.
11	MR. HUANG: No, no. The edge.
12	MS. PEARSON: Let's see what it
13	says.
14	MR. STAUDT: Matte black aluminum
15	frame.
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay.
17	MS. PEARSON: So it says matte?
18	MR. STAUDT: I'm looking at the
19	rear one, but it's on the front one as
20	well.
21	MS. PEARSON: Oh, yeah. Oh, I see.
22	(WHEREUPON, there was a sidebar
23	discussion held between Ms. Pearson and
24	Mr. Staudt.)
25	MR. STAUDT: We're looking for a

2	decorative metallic edge around your sign.
3	MR. HUANG: Okay.
4	MR. STAUDT: If you walk Main
5	Street, you'll see just about every sign
6	in the Village has some form of either
7	gold or silver.
8	MR. HUANG: Mine's black.
9	MR. STAUDT: Yeah, black is not
10	we're looking for gold or silver as sort
11	of an accent to the black.
12	MR. HUANG: Okay.
13	MR. STAUDT: If you drew a metallic
14	line in the middle of the black, silver or
15	gold (indicating).
16	MR. HUANG: Oh, I see.
17	MS. PEARSON: Black plus metallic
18	maybe.
19	MR. HUANG: Okay.
20	MR. STAUDT: It will elevate the
21	look of your sign too. It will only help
22	you in the long run.
23	MR. HUANG: Okay.
24	MR. STAUDT: We're just trying to
25	help you get it right the first time

2	around.
3	MR. HUANG: Sure.
4	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Anybody else
5	have any conditional questions?
6	(WHEREUPON, no response was heard.)
7	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And how would we
8	like to propose this motion in regards to
9	the front?
10	I think the rear is not a problem,
11	but, once again, the rear needs some
12	metallic in it, and we can bring that in.
13	How do we want to propose because
14	we've offered him two options today. One
15	is to replicate the rear to the front, and
16	either way my recommendation to the Board
17	and to Mr. Huang is to eliminate the phone
18	number on the sign, and then we can give
19	him two mock ups as to how we'd like to do
20	it. If he wants to mimic the back, he can
21	do that. If not, if he wants to do the
22	Wine Me Up with wine and liquor to the
23	right
24	MS. PEARSON: Centered.
25	MR. STAUDT: Centered from top to

3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Right. If we're
4	okay with that.
5	MR. STAUDT: Yes.
6	MS. PEARSON: Yes.
7	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Joe, do you want
8	to take a stab at this motion?
9	MR. STAUDT: Sure. I'll make a
10	motion to approve the applicant's proposal
11	under the condition that you add the
12	metallic bordering, silver or gold leaf
13	that's up to you.
14	And that you revise your proposal
15	to either mimic the front sign would
16	mimic the design of the rear sign with the
17	addition of the metallic, or you have the
18	other option to remove the phone number
19	from your front proposal and then center,
20	from top to bottom, the wine and liquor.
21	MR. HUANG: Okay.
22	MR. STAUDT: Can I get a second on
23	that?
24	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Sure. I'll
25	second that motion.

7	MR. HUANG: Thank you.
8	MS. PEARSON: Good luck. Welcome
9	to the Village.

12	application on the agenda this evening is
13	223 Main Street, and I'm going to guess
14	that Elyssa's here on that.
15	MS. KYLE: Yup, that's me.
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: How we doing?
17	MS. KYLE: Good. How you doing?
18	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good. Good.
19	MS. KYLE: Elyssa Kyle, and this is
20	Angela, the owner of the new store.
21	MR. STAUDT: Nice to meet you.
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Hi, how are you?
23	MS. CASIO: Hi, hello, how are you?
24	MS. KYLE: Going to where Vinoco
25	used to be is Angela's Bra Boutique.

2	I have a sign, kind of, modifying
3	her logo to fit within the dimensional
4	space that's there on the front of the
5	store, going for a more horizontal
6	proportion to fit the space.
7	So I have a black background with
8	white lettering, a little silver leaf
9	pinstripe border around the perimeter, and
10	then, kind of, laid on top on that is a
11	pink heart with a chest on it and a little
12	pink fairy, kind of, sprinkling her magic
13	over the hearts.
14	And then a similar for the blade
15	sign similar, just, kind of, oriented
16	and scaled down and oriented vertically to
17	fit the dimensions allowed by the blade
18	sign.
19	MS. PEARSON: I have a question.
20	MS. KYLE: Sure.
21	MS. PEARSON: I'm sorry, were you
22	finished?
23	MS. KYLE: I was going to say that
24	the lighting is already there from the
25	previous tenants, so we're working with

4	MS. PEARSON: Is this a chain, or
5	is this the first location?
6	MS. CASIO: This is the first.

10	A chain would be nice, but we've got to
11	start small.
12	MS. PEARSON: Well, start here.
13	The reason why I'm asking that is because
14	this is quite different than most of the
15	signs that we have in the Village, and we
16	have been known to be gracious to the
17	requirements of a chain, but since this is
18	not a chain, that sort of leads us to want
19	to align this sign with the other signs
20	that are in the Village, so, hence, my
21	question.
22	I have concerns about not the
23	anything about the sign except the graphic
24	of the breast and the bra. I find it odd
25	given that no other sign on Main Street

3	be considered something that we should put
4	up on Main Street.
5	I don't think it's appropriate for
6	our Village, so I'm wondering if there's
7	some sort of modification we could make to
8	the graphic.
9	MS. KYLE: In what way? In making
10	it not such a picture? Is it the type of
11	picture or that it is a picture?
12	MS. PEARSON: No, I don't have a
13	problem with it being a picture.
14	MS. KYLE: Okay.
15	MS. PEARSON: I think that naming
16	it Angela's Bra Boutique and also having
17	this particular picture might be a little
18	much for this Village.
19	MS. KYLE: Would I'm trying to
20	think. Redesigning on the fly is a little
21	challenging, but
22	MS. CASIO: We can go without the
23	picture if need be, you know, we can just
24	have Angela's Bra Boutique.
25	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: We're not

3	MS. PEARSON: Right.
4	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: I think the
5	issue is as presented. It was presented
6	as a chest. That's a problem. If you
7	read 462.1(c), it talks about welfare,
8	economic of business, I'm not sure what
9	affect it may have on a jewelry store next
10	door. I don't know these things, but,
11	overall, we don't have sex shops, not that
12	you're that
13	MS. CASIO: No, it's not.
14	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: (Continuing)
15	but it's still
16	MS. CASIO: Risque?
17	MS. PEARSON: It is risque. And
18	I'm going to share with you
19	MS. KYLE: I would say flirty.
20	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: We don't have
21	anything like it.
22	MS. PEARSON: (Continuing) I
23	will share with you that I am not a
24	particularly conservative person, but I
25	take my responsibility to this Village

2	very seriously, and the people who I am in		
3	contact with in other areas of this		
4	Village, I do not think that this is an		
5	image that they would like having on Main		
6	Street.		
7	We have many community events on		
8	Main Street, we have our Halloween Parade		
9	happening this Saturday, we have many		
10	events that involve a lot of children, and		
11	I just have to also be mindful of what the		
12	community would consider appropriate, so		
13	that's why I wanted to just, sort of,		
14	explain why I'm bringing these comments to		
15	you.		
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And it is, kind		
17	of, a continuation of the restrictions		
18	that we placed on the gay Pride Parade		
19	MS. KYLE: I wasn't familiar with		
20	what they had there.		
21	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: (Continuing)		
22	and what items were available in the		
23	outside courtyard and stuff like that.		
24	The feedback that we got on that		
25	tends to be more conservative than

2	liberal, so we're not opposed to a logo,			
3	and I probably would give you some leeway			
4	and some latitude on the color because you			
5	know the color is not within the color			
6	chart, correct?			
7	MS. KYLE: Right. But I don't

9	this sort of thing.			
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: No, I agree.			
11	MS. PEARSON: We have a red.			
12	MS. KYLE: Well, now we do. We			
13	didn't always have a red.			
14	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Honestly, I'm			
15	not worried about that.			
16	MS. KYLE: Okay.			
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: If you were to			
18	tell me we're going to clean up the logo a			
19	little bit			
20	MS. KYLE: If we can come with,			
21	maybe, something that's a little less			
22	descriptive, maybe, more of a silhouette			
23	or something?			
24	MS. PEARSON: That would be great.			
25	Again, we're not opposed to a logo.

3	more discreet.
4	MS. PEARSON: But we have to keep
5	in mind the type of community this is, and
6	what we think they would respond well too,
7	and we want you to be successful.
8	MS. CASIO: Of course.
9	MS. PEARSON: We want you to be
10	successful.
11	MR. STAUDT: And in some cases,
12	too, less is more sometimes works.
13	MS. CASIO: Of course.
14	MR. STAUDT: If you look at
15	Victoria's Secret or Blum's in Patchogue,
16	it doesn't necessarily have to be spelled
17	out so definitively what, you know
18	you're identifying yourself as a bra
19	boutique in the name, which is absolutely
20	fine, but I just think we're pushing it
21	far with the visual.
22	MS. KYLE: Okay.
23	MR. STAUDT: I think we're all in
24	agreement.
25	MS. CASIO: So that is my logo that

2	I had, actually, on my web page. That was
3	designed for me, that's why I was using
4	that, but if it's easier because I
5	don't want to have two conflicting
6	MR. STAUDT: Would it make sense to
7	just remove
8	MS. CASIO: That's what I'm saying.
9	It might make sense to just remove the
10	logo completely, and it will just be
11	Angela's Bra Boutique.
12	MS. KYLE: Okay. Then, maybe, just
13	have the little bit the fairy
14	MS. CASIO: Maybe
15	MS. KYLE: (Continuing) just
16	referencing it.
17	MS. CASIO: (Continuing) because
18	I think I would rather have no logo than a
19	conflicting kind of thing.
20	MS. KYLE: Okay. That's fair.
21	MR. STAUDT: And, obviously, that
22	would go with the blade sign as well.
23	MS. KYLE: Right.
24	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: If you're
25	willing to make that modification, it's a

3	MS. CASIO: Yeah.

5	take a vote on it, but I think that your
6	concession and your adjustment on your

9	have the Heritage Red available now.
10	MS. KYLE: Okay.
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: But if you
12	wanted to drift a little bit more into a
13	softer red, I don't have a problem with
14	that.
15	MS. KYLE: Okay. I'll take a look
16	at the Heritage Red.
17	MR. STAUDT: We're talking about
18	the fairy?
19	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Yeah, the fairy
20	at this point.
21	MR. STAUDT: Well, do you think
22	yeah, okay.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And you did
24	mention, Elyssa, there is metallic on the
25	border on that?

3	silver pinstripe around the edge. It,
4	kind of, gets interrupted by the text and
5	then wraps around.
6	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay, everyone
7	want to make a movement on this motion?
8	MS. SCHOTT: The height of the
9	sign, Craig?
10	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: The height of
11	the sign is going to remain consistent
12	with the Wings Over Farmingdale, correct?
13	MS. KYLE: Yeah. It's a two-foot
14	high box with little bits that were
15	sticking outside of that.
16	MR. STAUDT: I think it was the
17	placement of that, right?
18	MS. SCHOTT: Right.
19	MR. STAUDT: It wasn't the height
20	of the sign itself we were concerned with,
21	it was where you were going to put it on
22	the facade.
23	MS. PEARSON: The alignment with
24	the other businesses.
25	MR. STAUDT: We want to consider

2	where the signs are on the adjoining
3	tenants.
4	MS. KYLE: Well, going back to
5	remembering when the approvals of the
6	neighbors on either side, I believe
7	Candy's was approved as it was, and then
8	many Boards ago, after it went up, they
9	didn't like how low it was, so when Wings
10	went for approval, they wanted Wings to
11	have it up higher, so I was matching Wings
12	since that's what previous Boards said
13	before.
14	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That's your
15	intent? To match it to the same height as
16	Wings?
17	MS. KYLE: Yeah.
18	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay.
19	MS. KYLE: To line it up
20	horizontally.
21	MS. STAUDT: As long as you're in
22	line with one of them.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: You could fix
24	that facade tremendously by matching.
25	MS. KYLE: Yeah.

3	fine.
4	MS. KYLE: Yeah, you don't want
5	three entirely different things.
6	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. Anybody
7	else have any additional questions?
8	(WHEREUPON, no response was heard.)
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: In regards to
10	the application in regards to 223 Main
11	Street, it is approved as presented.
12	There has been some discussion
13	extensively in regards to removing that
14	logo, and they are going to remove that
15	logo on both the front signage and the
16	blade sign, and, certainly, they are
17	entitled to keep either the fairy and/or
18	whatever their preference is in regards to
19	that.
20	That sign is to be centered to the
21	front facade similar to the Wings Over
22	Farmingdale.
23	And in regards to the coloring of
24	the fairy dust, whatever they may be
25	sprinkling, they've been offered the

2	option of Heritage Red or the Chestnut,			
3	which is more in the burgundy family,			
4	which you may not want to go to. Also you			
5	can lean away from red and come more			
6	towards the pink side.			
7	MS. KYLE: Okay. Because I was			
8	going to say I'm afraid that darker colors			
9	might not contrast enough against the			
10	black to stand out.			
11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Absolutely.			
12	And other that, that lighting has			
13	previously been done, so that's not a			
14	problem, and that would be it.			
15	Can I get a second on that motion?			
16	MS. PEARSON: I'll second.			
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: All those in			
18	favor?			
19	(WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous,			
20	affirmative vote of the Board members			
21	present. Motion passed 5-0.)			
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good luck,			
23	Angela.			
24	MS. CASIO: Thank you.			
25	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Do we have a
