RESOLVED (#2018-11-18), to approve Rosemar, Inc. to construct a new concrete walkway at 254 Main Street to connect Parking Lot 1 to Main Street in the amount of \$7,200 in accordance with our requirements contract in and new lighting fixtures to be supplied by Magniflood and installed by the Town of Oyster Bay under our inter-municipal agreement in the estimated amount of \$12,000, at a total cost of \$19,200.

CROSS ACCESS AGREEMENT – Upon a motion made by Trustee Priestley and seconded by Trustee Parisi, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2018-11-20), to enter into a cross access agreement with White Swan Cleaners to create a new paved access way between Conklin Street and Parking Lot 3. The new access will be 124' long and 24' wide from the western boundary of the property to the building line. The cost to construct is estimated to be \$10,440.

PIERS FOR MONUMENT SIGNS – Upon a motion made by Trustee Parisi and seconded by Deputy Mayor Christiansen, it was unanimously,

RESOLVED (#2018-11-21), to approve the purchase of up to 12 pre-cast piers from B&R Cast Iron and Coastal Pipeline to be used in the installation of new monument signs in public parking lots. The piers are 2x2x4 above grade with 3x3x3 underground at a cost of \$850/pier.

BEAUTIFICATION – Deputy Mayor Christiansen reported that fall mums were planted by volunteers in early October. The mums in the Village Green fountain as well as the fall display in Village Green are just beautiful. Holiday decorating will be underway beginning on November 16th with decorating of the wreaths. On November 18th the wreaths will be hung along with the garland on the Gazebo and on November 27th volunteers will decorate the park at Main Street and Melville Road as well as Village Green and Gerngras Park. Deputy Mayor Christiansen stressed that many volunteers are needed to complete these tasks.
