3	to just rise, we're going to say the
4	National Anthem. We do actually have a
5	little formality still going on.
6	So that being said, welcome
7	tonight, to everybody, to the Farmingdale
8	Village Board Planning Board meeting for
9	December 27th, the year 2023 (sic). Happy
10	holidays to everybody.
11	We do always start the meeting off
12	with the National Anthem, and my fellow
13	co-member, Joe Staudt, is going to take us
14	away with that.
15	(WHEREUPON, the Pledge of
16	Allegiance was recited.)
17	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And once again,
18	as always, we always take a moment of
19	silence to thank our military and first
20	responders for providing us with the
21	freedoms that we enjoy on a daily basis
22	and through this holiday season.
23	(WHEREUPON, a moment of silence was
24	observed.)
25	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Thank you.

2	Please be seated.
3	As before mentioned, there is only
4	one application on the board on the
5	itinerary for this evening, and that is
6	342 Main Street.
7	When I call the application, just
8	kindly stand up, state your name and
9	address for the record so she can record
10	it, and then you go ahead and make your
11	presentation.
12	MR. NAGLE: Okay.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: First
14	application is 342 Main Street.
15	Take it away.
16	MR. NAGLE: Nicholas Nagle, Letter
17	Perfect Graphics, coming in for the permit
18	for the awning for Kick'n Chicken.
19	COURT REPORTER: Can you spell your
20	last name?
21	MR. NAGLE: N-I-C-H-O-L-A-S
22	N-A-G-L-E.
23	COURT REPORTER: Thank you.
24	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Your form, Nick,
25	tell me what you guys are looking to do.

2	MR. NAGLE: Just looking to get
3	the permit for the awning that's there
4	that's built. I was told by the owner
5	they didn't have a permit so he told me to
6	make sure it's all taken care of. So I
7	came in and filed right away, and that's
8	why I'm here.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. Why don't
10	you tell us about the awning; the material
11	it's made out of; the sizing and stuff
12	like that; how far it will project. I
13	know it's in the application. We'll make
14	a record of it.
15	MR. NAGLE: Yeah, it's welded
16	aluminum, two-by-six, quarter-inch wall
17	sheeting with 080. It's through-bolted
18	through a quarter-inch steel I-beam. The
19	uprights are about two feet, they're going
20	to have they're steel turnbuckles. It
21	is about just shy of 12 feet to match the
22	window. We made it so it'd fit the
23	general storefront. It doesn't go
24	edge-to-edge but it fits the window so it
25	looks like it should be made that way to

2	begin with.
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay.
4	MR. NAGLE: And it was just
5	painted black. And that's pretty much it.
6	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: What's the
7	projection on the awning itself?
8	MR. NAGLE: I think 30 inches?
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Your application
10	says 30.
11	MR. NAGLE: Yeah, 30, it's been a
12	while, so 30 inches, yes.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay, and there
14	is lighting built into that awning; is
15	that correct?
16	MR. NAGLE: Yes, it's canless LED
17	lights, all waterproof, it's all BX,
18	that's right inside, no exposed wire, they
19	can be switched to multiple colors and
20	dimmed down if needed, and I think there's
21	about five of them, six of them. Five?
22	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Yeah.
23	MR. NAGLE: Spaced out evenly, so
24	you know, as far as electric, everything's
25	waterproof, it's all, you know, has the UL

2	Listed, and you know
3	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay.
4	MR. NAGLE: (Continuing) it's
5	all canless stuff.
6	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And the physical
7	awning itself is flat horizontal; correct?
8	MR. NAGLE: Yes.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And then what do
10	we do in regards to any type of pitch
11	and/or
12	MR. NAGLE: Yes.
13	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: (Continuing)
14	mediation regarding snow and ice and stuff
15	like that?
16	MR. NAGLE: It's pitched slightly
17	to the left for the water runoff. I know
18	it can hold a lot of weight on top. I
19	don't know exact number in weight but it's
20	I could probably like I said, I
21	could probably stand on the thing, and it
22	won't go nowhere.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay.
24	MR. NAGLE: I've been doing this
25	for a long time, and I've never had

2	anything fall, knock on wood. I usually
3	overkill everything because my mentality
4	is I'd rather the building fall down with
5	my sign on it than my sign fall down in
6	the first place. So everything's
7	overkill. So you know, I don't see any
8	it going anywhere.
9	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. In
10	addition to weight-wise on top of the
11	awning itself, is there a structure that's
12	preventing it from swaying right and left
13	because we've got a north/south wind that
14	comes straight down that corridor.
15	MR. NAGLE: Yeah, it's
16	through-bolted in three to four three
17	different locations with half-inch rod,
18	and it's exact fit threaded rod, there's
19	no really room for wiggle room, so it
20	can't go left to right, and then the
21	turnbuckles going up and down would stop
22	that from doing that regardless, anyway.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay, and I
24	believe that Joe had a question for you
25	regarding the lighting that was underneath

2	mounted into the actual awning.
3	MR. STAUDT: Right. So we just
4	want to make sure that the lighting
5	temperature matches from the goosenecks
6	down to the under the awning lighting, the
7	canless lighting you were speaking of.
8	MR. NAGLE: Yes.
9	MR. STAUDT: And I think you were
10	saying earlier, I just wanted to put it on
11	the record, that we had the ability to
12	switch the color temperature.
13	MR. NAGLE: Yes.
14	MR. STAUDT: So we prefer that it
15	be as warm as possible.
16	MR. NAGLE: More yellow.
17	MR. STAUDT: To match.
18	MR. NAGLE: To match.
19	MR. STAUDT: Right. So 27 to 3,000
20	Kelvin is the general
21	MR. NAGLE: Okay.
22	MR. STAUDT: (Continuing)
23	guidance we give
24	MR. NAGLE: Uh-huh.
25	MR. STAUDT: (Continuing) along

2	Main Street, and if we can make that
3	switch, and then keep it to, you know, I
4	guess it's a visual call but we want the
5	dimness to sort of be equal. So we don't
6	want the under lighting to be much
7	brighter than what you're seeing on the
8	goosenecks.
9	MR. NAGLE: You want to match the
10	goosenecks.
11	MR. STAUDT: Correct.
12	MR. NAGLE: Okay. What I'll do is,
13	I'll take a picture on the way out and
14	then so I know what it looks like at
15	nighttime so I come back
16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That's fine.
17	MR. NAGLE: (Continuing) during
18	the day, and I can kind of gauge it
19	better.
20	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Anything
21	additional; guys?
22	MR. STAUDT: No.
23	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Nothing?
24	MR. STAUDT: I think we covered it.
25	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Okay. So I'm

2	going to make a motion to approve the
3	application for 342 Main Street with
4	Kick'n Chicken with the provision that the
5	under mounted LED canless soffit lights
б	be the switches be switched down to the
7	lower Kelvin in the 2,700 to 3,000 Kelvin
8	range, and that's for a permanent as
9	opposed to a dimmable light.
10	Other than that, I would ask that
11	it be approved in it's entirety.
12	Do I have a second?
13	MR. STAUDT: I'll second that.
14	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: All in favor?
15	(WHEREUPON, there was a unanimous
16	affirmative vote of the Board members
17	present.)
18	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Good luck.
19	MR. NAGLE: Okay. Timeframe to do
20	it? Two weeks okay?
21	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Yeah, that's
22	fine.
23	MR. NAGLE: Okay.
24	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: Absolutely.
25	MR. NAGLE: Because this week's a

5	no problem. Okay?

11	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: That being said,
12	do we have a motion for adjournment?

16	CHAIRMAN ROSASCO: And all those in
17	favor?
