Bartone Noise Solution Presentation – Anthony Bartone addressed the Board and presented the findings of Kimberly A. Riegel, Ph.D. of Lewis S. Goodfriend & Associates, Acoustical Engineers. The findings indicate that under the worst case scenario, 172 cars all leaving the garage at the same time each hour, every hour, the garage is not expected to have a significant impact on nearby residences. Noise level using this scenario is significantly below the HUD guideline.

Mr. Bartone further advised that he will be meeting with his landscape architect tomorrow and invited Trustees Parisi and Ryan to attend the meeting.

He remains optimistic that ground breaking will be in August 2012.

Walls Farms Productions – Filming took place at two homes on Prospect Street for an upcoming movie. Additional filming will take place at the Village Hall Courtroom on June 13th. Prior approval was granted by the Board. The Fire Department will be notified in the future of any similar activities where the streets are obstructed.

New energy efficient lighting has been installed in Village Hall and installation in the Fire Department will be completed by the end of the week.

Road Construction – Work will begin this week on road construction at Pinehurst, Manetto, Taylor, Lincoln, Sullivan Roads and Ivy Street. Work will include complete repaving, new curbs and driveway aprons.
